WHAT ARE WE WORKING ON THIS WEEK IN CLASS?

- 1. **ELA:** This week, students will be reading a biography about Luis Braille called "Luis Braille's Gift to the Blind." Students will learn about the amazing man who created the Braille system. Our grammar focus is action and state-of-being verbs. We will also continue our first novel study on the book Holes as well as our first writer's workshop project.
- 2. **Math:** This week, students will continue learning about place value in class! We will focus on adding and subtracting large numbers, as well as practicing rounding. Students will also continue to practice their multiplication facts by focusing on the 2's or 3's this week (if they passed their x2 Friday quiz).
- 3. **Science:** This week, we will continue our Science unit titled *Birth of Rocks*. Students will learn about different types of volcanoes and will also do an exciting lava experiment in class!
- 4. **Social Studies:** This week, students will continue learning about California's regions. I can't wait to see the amazing region collages they create throughout this unit!
- 5. **Second Step:** This week, our social/emotional program focuses on empathy and listening skills.
- 6. **Homework:** Each day this week, your child will be coming home with about 30-40 minutes of homework. This will include the following: Reading for 20 minutes, completing a spelling activity from the spelling menu, completing a math worksheet or assignment, and completing an ELA page from the ELA packet. Don't forget to initial those planners daily that work was completed.
