WHAT ARE WE WORKING ON THIS WEEK IN CLASS?

- 1. **ELA:** This week, students continue our new unit that focuses on American History. We will read a story called *Ben and the Emancipation Proclamation*. Students will learn about the executive order President Lincoln signed in 1863 freeing enslaved people in the Southern states. This selection is based on a true story about a boy who grew up enslaved in South Carolina.
- 2. **Math:** This week, students begin learning about fractions, specifically looking at what a fraction is and how to determine if a fraction is equivalent or not to other fractions.
- 3. **Science:** This week and next, we will focus on our third Science Unit of the year. This unit centers around waves of sound and how sound works.
- 4. **Social Studies:** This week, we continue our studies of California's indigenous people. Students will be learning about the Native Californians located in the mountain and central valley regions.
- **5. Homework:** This week, students will read for 20 minutes, studying their spelling words, complete their ELA packets, work on math, and finish typing up their book reports.
