WHAT ARE WE WORKING ON THIS WEEK IN CLASS?

- 1. **ELA:** This week, students begin a new unit that focuses on American History. We will begin with a story about a Navajo man, and his experience as a code breaker during World War II.
- 2. **Math:** This week, students will learn about factors and multiples from chapter 5 in our math program. This is a quick chapter, and students will wrap it up this week. It is mostly review of things they already know!
- 3. **Science:** This week, we begin our Waves of Sound unit.
- 4. **Social Studies:** This week, we continue our California Indigenous Peoples Unit. Students will learning about the Native Californians located in the southern coastal region, specifically the Chumash, Gabrielino, and Luiseno tribes.
