WHAT ARE WE WORKING ON THIS WEEK IN CLASS?

1. **ELA:** This week, students will learn about astronaut Sally Ride! I can't wait to discuss with them all of her amazing accomplishments.
2. **Math:** This week, students will continue learning about long division. They are working through the steps of Divide, Multiply, Subtract, Compare, and Bring Down to solve problems.
