Covid-19 Guidance

I hope everyone was able to review the alert Mrs. Pugno shared on Friday regarding Covid-19 in our classroom. Tests came home with every child on Friday. If your child is experiencing any flu-like symptoms, please test prior to their return to school tomorrow. Additionally, if you child tests positive, please follow the CDPH Covid-19 guidelines:

* Stay home for at least 5 days



- * Isolation can end after Day 5 if symptoms are not present and the student has been feverfree, without fever-reducing medication, for a minimum of 24 hours
- * If fever or symptoms are present after Day 5, isolation should continue until they resolve and the student is fever-free for 24 hours without fever-reducing medication
- * Wear a well-fitting mask around others for a total of 10 days, especially in indoor settings.

WHAT ARE WE WORKING ON THIS WEEK IN CLASS?

- 1. **ELA:** This week, students will begin drafting their first five paragraph personal narratives during Writer's Workshop. We will go step by step through the process together!
- 2. **Math:** This week, students will have their first math test of the year on place value. We will be reviewing Tuesday and Wednesday of this week in preparation. We are also continuing to practice our multiplication facts daily.
- 3. **Science:** This week, we will continue our Science unit titled *Birth of Rocks*. We will be focusing on lava and the differences between cone and shield shaped volcanoes.
- 4. **Social Studies:** This week, students will continue learning about California's regions. They will be collaging a beautiful mountain region scene on Thursday!
- 5. Second Step: This week, our social emotional program focuses on listening with attention
- 6. **Homework:** Each day this week, your child will be coming home with about 30-40 minutes of homework. This will include the following: Reading for 20 minutes, completing a spelling activity from the spelling menu, completing a math worksheet or assignment, and completing an ELA page from the ELA packet. NEW: Look for book report pacing guides coming home next week!

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
