- FOCUS Remember that when you know the meaning of a Greek root, you can determine the meaning of the English word that contains it.
  - The Greek root phon means "sound."
  - The Greek root graph means "write."

# **Prepositions and Prepositional Phrases**

FOCUS • A preposition is a word that relates a noun, pronoun, or group of words to some other word in the sentence. Prepositions usually indicate relationships of time or place. They can also give more information.

The cookies are on the third shelf.

They are stacked **above** the crackers.

Bring me a list of your favorite snacks.

 The noun or pronoun that follows a preposition is called the object of the preposition. A preposition must have an object. It cannot stand alone.

The crackers are stored with the cookies.

(preposition) (object)

The sauce should be **beside** the **spaghetti.** 

(preposition) (object)

 A prepositional phrase is made up of a preposition, its object, and any words in between.

The food is in the cabinet.

The cabinet **below the sink** needs to be cleaned.
